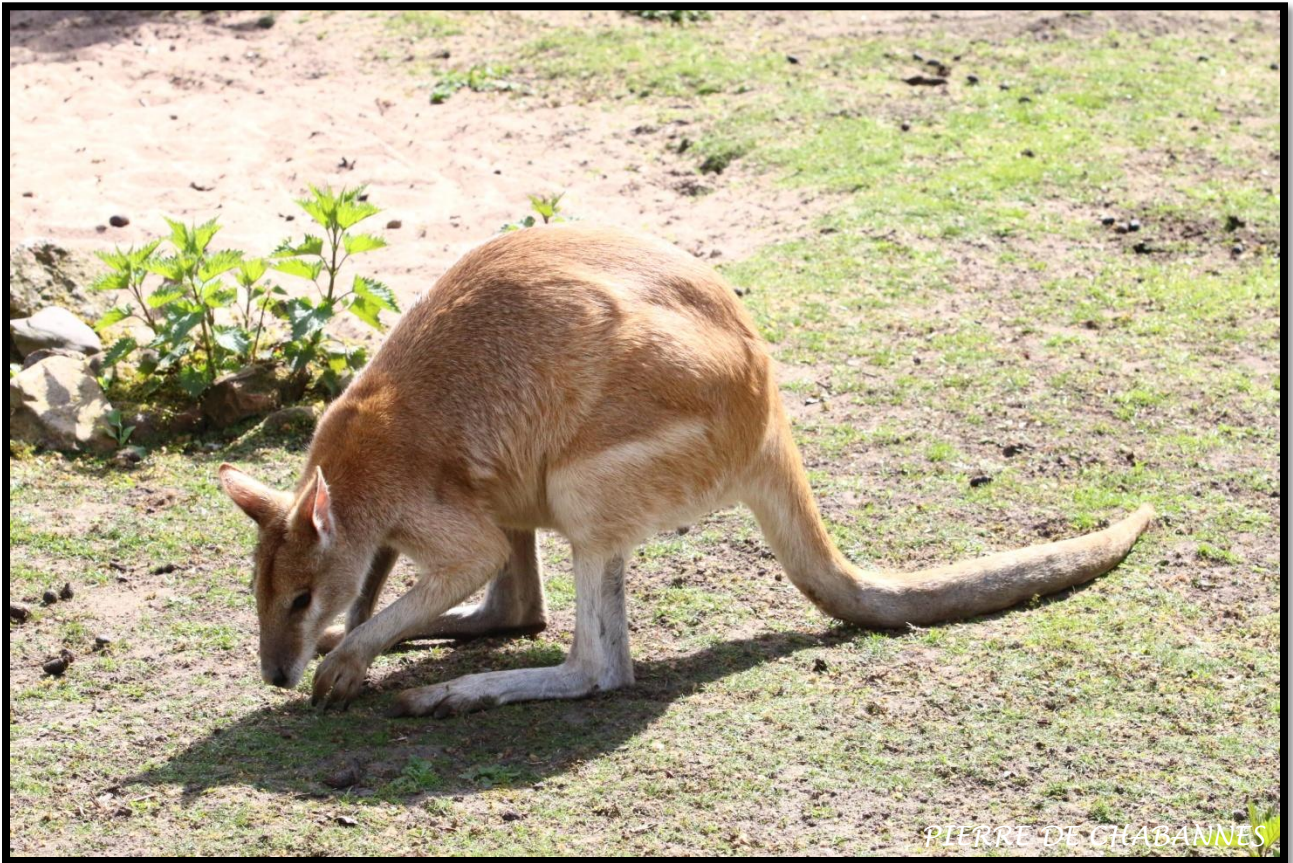


# AGILE WALLABY

## LEAST CONCERN

**Identification** : 85 cm body length (tail 84 cm), weight up to 27 kg, females are smaller. Slender-bodied species with a prominent white line on hind limbs, white belly and white cheek line. This subspecies has a clear beige-brown coloration.

**Range**: This subspecies occurs in Northern Territory, the species is found in Northern Australia and southern New Guinea.

**Habitat** : Grasslands, open forests and woodlands. Avoid hilly country.

**Behavior**: The species is most often seen alone but sometimes occurs in small groups. Feeds mostly during the evening and night. Mostly herbivorous.

**Status in the wild**: The Australian populations aren't at risk and occur in many protected areas. The species is sometimes considered a crop pest.

**In captivity**: The species is relatively common in Australian zoos but seems much rarer outside Australia. Very rare or even absent from American zoos. This subspecies has been imported to Europe occasionally and is displayed in 2 zoos.
